**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the week of October 2-8, 2016 be designated the 30<sup>th</sup> annual Public Power Week in order to honor Muscatine Power and Water for its contributions to the community and to make its consumer-owners, policymakers, and employees more aware of Muscatine Power and Water's overall contributions to the community; and**

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that our community joins hands with more than 2,000 other public power systems in the United States in this celebration of public power and recognition that Muscatine Power and Water is good for consumers, business, the community, and the nation.**
