

Muscatine County Board of Supervisors
Monday, October 22, 2018

The Muscatine County Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. with Howard, Mather, Sauer, Sorensen and Bonebrake present. Chairperson Sauer presiding.

On a motion by Sorensen, second by Bonebrake, the agenda was approved as presented. Ayes: All.

On a motion by Howard, second by Sorensen, claims dated October 22, 2018 were approved in the amount of \$927,685.56. Ayes: All.

Discussion was held with C. Scott Richardson, 1109 1st Avenue, Muscatine, regarding a request from Muscatine County Amateur Radio Emergency Service to park their mobile communications trailer in the Washington Street lot owned by the County and to access County electricity. Howard stated he does not want to add anything to the Washington Street property until a decision is made on whether or not to keep the property. Bonebrake and Sorensen agreed with Howard. Sorensen stated he wants to see what the current study due next week recommends be done with that property. Board consensus was they are not willing to allow the trailer to be parked in the Washington Street lot at this time.

County Engineer Keith White updated the Board on secondary road projects.

On a motion by Howard, second by Bonebrake, the County Engineer's Office was authorized to open a credit card account with a \$5,000 limit. Ayes: All.

On a motion by Bonebrake, second by Mather, minutes of the October 15, 2018 regular meeting were approved as written. Ayes: All.

No correspondence was noted.

Committee Reports:

All Supervisors met for exit interviews with State Auditors October 17th for the completion of the FY17-18 Audit.

Bonebrake and Sorensen attended a Muscatine County Joint Communications Commission meeting October 16th.

Sorensen attended a West Liberty Economic Area Development meeting October 18th.

Howard attended a Milestones Area on Aging Agency meeting October 16th.

Information Services Director Bill Riley updated the Board on developments at the Jail which disconnected remote access over the weekend affecting the Sheriff's Deputies' squad cars ability to connect remotely to the server stored at the Public Safety building due to the City of Muscatine being hit with malware last week.

Discussion was held with Administrative Services Director Nancy Schreiber regarding upcoming term expirations on various boards and commissions. Schreiber asked for direction on whether to

advertise or not as some upcoming openings on the Historic Preservation Commission and Board of Health as the current appointments have already been appointed for two terms, but they are still interested in being reappointed. Board consensus was to still advertise the upcoming openings, but encourage the current appointees to apply again if they are interested.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:36 A.M.
