

Muscatine County Board of Supervisors
Monday, July 13, 2020

The Muscatine County Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. with Holliday, Sauer, Sorensen, Mather and Saucedo. Chairperson Sorensen presiding.

On a motion by Saucedo, second by Mather, the agenda was approved as presented. Ayes: All.

On a motion by Sauer, second by Holliday, claims dated July 13, 2020 were approved in the amount of \$692,532.40. Ayes: All.

On a motion by Saucedo, second by Sauer, the Board approved an ordinance rezoning approximately 0.28 acres in Montpelier Township from C-1 Commercial District to C-2 Commercial District on the second of three readings. Roll call vote: Ayes: All.

On a motion by Sauer, second by Mather, the Board approved an ordinance rezoning approximately 18.92 acres in Fulton Township from A-1 Agricultural District to R-1 Residential District on the second of three readings. Roll call vote: Ayes: All.

On a motion by Mather, second by Holliday, the Board approved the Muscatine County Recorder's Report of Fees Collected for the quarter ending June 30, 2020 in the amount of \$76,341.11. Ayes: All.

On a motion by Saucedo, second by Sauer, the Board appointed Zoning Administrator Eric Furnas as Muscatine County's primary representative to the Lower Cedar Watershed Management Authority. Ayes: All.

On a motion by Mather, second by Saucedo, minutes of the July 6, 2020 regular meeting were approved as written. Ayes: All.

County Engineer Keith White updated the Board on secondary road projects. White reported that he virtually attended the Iowa Association of County Engineer's Mid-Year Convention. White reported the Road Use Tax fund was down 26% in May, but only 16% down in June, with expectations for the Road Use Tax fund to level out at 10% down for awhile.

Emergency Manager Brian Wright stated there have been 690 COVID cases, 45 deaths and 559 recovered in Muscatine County. Wright reported no long term care facilities are in an outbreak situation at this time. Wright stated there has been a slight increase in COVID cases in Muscatine County.
