The Muscatine County Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. with Holliday, Sauer, Sorensen, Mather and Saucedo present. Chairperson Sorensen presiding.

On a motion by Mather, second by Sauer, the agenda was approved as presented. Ayes: All.

On a motion by Sauer, second by Holliday, claims dated December 7, 2020 were approved in the amount of \$570,043.76. Ayes: All.
