Re: Surplus Equipment

INTRODUCTION: The city has signed a new contract with Jim Hahn that extends until December 31, 2020 to apply biosolids to this property located west of the WPCP. With this extension, some of the existing application equipment that was used to transport the biosolids to other property and the slurry tank with accessories will not be needed. Rather than just have this equipment sitting around and deteriorating it is our recommendation it be sold. Following is a list of that equipment:

- 1- 7400 gallon slurry tank with a pull type injector equipped with a Ravens monitor. The city purchased this in 2003 and has taken very good care of it. Estimated value of this is \$40K-\$50K.
- 2- 7500 gallon semi tanker trailers. We still have one more, but plan to keep it as a backup in case we have to pump a lift station. Estimated value is \$10K-\$12K each.

Because of the past use of these we have contacted companies that may be looking for this kind of equipment and have had a good response.

RECOMMENDATION/RATIONALE: We are requesting the council declare these items as surplus and we will put them out for bids. Please include this item on the council agenda for July 19, 2012.
