Re: Airport Project Completion – Rehabilitate Airfield Pavements

INTRODUCTION: The City of Muscatine entered into a Grant Agreement with the FAA to fund an airport improvement project identified as "Rehabilitate Airfield Pavements", further identified as AIP Project No. 3-19-0063-17.

BACKGROUND: Following the preparation of plans and specifications, the project was bid and a contract was awarded to Hy-Brand Industrial Contractors of Muscatine in the amount of \$52,889.83 on June 21, 2012. The Project has now been completed with 1 change order in the amount of \$5,707.86 for a total Project construction cost of \$58,597.69.

RECOMMENDATION/RATIONALE: The Project has been reviewed by the City's project engineer and staff and found to be in compliance with the approved plans and specifications. Therefore, it is recommended that the City Council adopt the attached resolution accepting the completed work under the Project identified as "Rehabilitate Airfield Pavements" at the Muscatine Municipal Airport and authorizing the release of the retention within thirty days of adoption of the resolution.

WHEREAS, the City of Muscatine approved the Plans, Specifications, and Form of Contract for an improvement project identified as “Rehabilitate Airfield Pavements” the Muscatine Municipal Airport; and

WHEREAS, the City of Muscatine entered into a contract for said project with Hy-Brand Industrial Contractors LTD of Muscatine for \$52,889.83, with 1 change order of \$5,707.86 for a total Project cost of \$58,597.69; and

WHEREAS, work under said contract has been completed by Hy-Brand Industrial Contractors, LTD, and approved and accepted by Anderson-Bogert Engineers & Surveyors, engineers for the City as having met the requirements of the Plans and Specifications adopted by this Council; and

WHEREAS, the amount of \$52,737.93 has been previously paid to Hy-Brand Industrial Contractors, LTD, leaving a retainage of \$5,859.77 which is due and payable to Hy-Brand Industrial Contractors, LTD, within thirty (30) days of approval of this Resolution,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MUSCATINE, IOWA, that the City hereby accepts all work under the airport improvement project identified as “Rehabilitate Airfield Pavements.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the final retainage payment of \$5,859.77 be paid to Hy-Brand Industrial Contractors, LTD, thirty (30) days from the date of the adoption of this Resolution.
