We have foundation problems on the Carport Side of our house. When it rains, the water running down the hospital driveway goes down the side of our carport causing erosion. The carport is pulling apart in some areas and crushing cinder blocks in others. So much water has ran into the larger cracks on top and dripped into the room under the carport causing the ceiling and support beams to rust and crumble.

We would like to fill in the room under the carport with gravel and extend it over leaving room for a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ -3 ft walkway down to the lower patio and yard. On top of the built up cement we would like to build an addition of a 20ft by 20ft<sup>total</sup> 2 car garage with a single 16ft door and a 30 inch man door. Having the solid foundation would help prevent the erosion from happening again.
